# Local Weed Warriors


We are celebrating the volunteer efforts of the many weed warriors who have been helping with the invasive species removals. Each spring for the last twelve years, a group of Audubon members and concerned citizens have been pulling garlic mustard, dames rocket, and celandine. In the fall, the weed warriors have been tackling buckthorn. Our Audubon sponsored sessions have focused on the Peebles Trail, Lallier Park, Hobbs Woods, and an adopted area out in the Kettle Moraine, that is within Fond du Lac County. The number of volunteer hours is now well over 2,000 and has made a difference. A huge thanks to all who have given some of their time and energy to saving our wild habitat areas.

# Fond du Lac (Snowy Owl) Update

After "going dark" during 2021, the snowy owl named Fond du Lac returned and was as near as Lake Winnebago this winter. She quickly found her way to the Traverse City area in Michigan and has remained in that area. An anonymous donor has donated through Fond du Lac County Audubon Society multiple times to provide transmitters that provide GPS data to researchers. # Summer Invasive Species Removals

Volunteers are needed to help remove garlic mustard, dames rocket, and celandine. These plants are taking over our wild areas. The Fond du Lac County Audubon Society is sponsoring these sessions:

### HOBBS WOODS

June 11 (Saturday), June 13 (Monday), June 15 (Wednesday), June 18 (Saturday) Meet at Hobbs Woods County Park (five miles south of Fond du Lac on Hickory Street).

### PEEBLES TRAIL

Session 1: May 28 (Saturday), May 31 (Tuesday) Meet at the intersection with Prairie Road (¼ mile south of Winnebago Drive).

Session 2: June 2 (Thursday), June 4 (Saturday), June 6 (Monday), June 8 (Wednesday) Meet at the intersection with County Highway K (<sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> mile south of Winnebago Drive).

### **KETTLE MORAINE ADOPTED AREA** June 20 (Monday) at 9:00 am.

Check with Diana Beck for directions.

May sessions: 9 to 11 am. June sessions: 8 to 10 am. Canceled if steady rain. Please bring work gloves. Long pants and a long-sleeved shirt are recommended (due to possible stinging nettle plants). # SUMMER EVENING TUESDAY WALKS

E xplore trails and yards in Fond du Lac County and City with members of Audubon. All walks begin at 6:30 pm. Wear good walking shoes, bring insect repellent, and binoculars if available. The walks will last an hour to an hour and a half. For more information about the summer walks, contact *dianahbeck@gmail.com or 920-922-7931*.

**May 31** *Eldorado Marsh* The .75 mile-long dike provides excellent wildlife viewing opportunities. West on 23, east on Heinrich, north on Dike Road. *Leader – Adam Knueppel* 

June 7 Mullet Creek State Wildlife Area

Explore a rich array of wetland, forest, grassland, and farmland. Mullet Creek flows through the entire property, eventually joining the Sheboygan River. Be prepared for the possibility of bugs and perhaps muddy conditions. Take Hwy 23 east several miles. Turn RIGHT on Pit Road (after Log Cabin Road). When Pit Road ends, turn left on Old Town Hall Road. Stay on Old Town Hall Road until it ends at Banner Road. Take a right on Banner Road. Banner will turn from a paved to a gravel road. Follow Banner Road until it ends in a gravel parking lot. Park here and look for Margie. Bring binoculars. Leader – Margie Winter

June 14 Shaginappi County Park The park is a natural area of 100 acres of wetlands, lakeshore, woods, and prairie and is situated adjacent to Columbia Park, sharing Calumet Harbor. Pipe Creek also winds through the park property. North on Hwy 151 to just north of Pipe. Turn left on Velvet Beach Road. Continue about ½ mile and turn into a parking lot on the left. Leaders – Dave & Kerry Sehloff

**June 21** *Ledge Hike and Yard Tour* Hike Oakfield Ledge (northern portion). Meet in small parking lot on Cty Y just beyond water tower. After the hike, join us for a Habitat Yard Tour in Oakfield, featuring a rain barrel system. *Leader – Diana Beck* 

**June 28** *Marsh Haven Nature Center* See purple martin nestlings. Hike a section of the trail and see the nature center. Three miles east of Waupun on Hwy 49. *Leader – Diana Beck* 

**July 5** *Habitat Yard Tour* The yard tour will start at N7141 Leonard Drive that features birdscaping. Then the group will move to 529 Willow Drive with many native plants. *Leaders – Diana Beck and Evelyn McLean-Cowan* 

**July 12** *Lakeside Park West* Explore the new trail. Meet by the dog park. *Leader – Margie Winter* 

**July 19** *Greenway Arboretum* Discover over two miles of beautiful nature trails along the Fond du Lac River on 24.5 acres in town. Through the efforts of ParkWatch and local citizen volunteers, restoration

of native tree plantings and an oak savanna are in progress, along with new walking trails.

> Meet at the west side of the parking lot at the south Pick 'n Save store at 55 West Pioneer Road.

July 26 Izaak Walton League N6491 County Road K. Go south ¼ mile on Hwy K from Hwy 23. Parking lot is on the left. This private property on the Ledge features an open forested area, wildflowers, and beautiful stream sites. Leader – Liz Roy

**August 2** *Kiekhaefer Park W4235 Kiekhaefer Parkway.* This park of 120 acres has wonderful trails through hilly, wooded terrain and is part of the Niagara Escarpment. *Leader – Diana Beck* 

August 9 Gottfried Prairie & Arboretum

The Gottfried Prairie & Arboretum offers 37.5 acres of native prairie. It includes 55 kinds of native wildflowers and six species of grass, as well as a 3.5 acre formal arboretum of 250 native trees and 140 native shrubs. Meet in the east parking lot at the UW campus, 400 University Drive. *Leader – Margie Winter* 


August 16 Habitat Yard Tour at Liz Roy Property N5806 Esterbrook Road. Please ride share if possible. Explore a one and a half acre property that has reduced turf grass. The owner has introduced a few plants, but allows nature to take over. The back half acre is now wild and thick with dogwoods, prairie plants, milkweed, asters, coneflowers, etc. See a frog feeding. There will be a drawing for a dozen fresh backyard eggs from her chicken flock.


