Bird Window Strike Project and Peregrine Falcon Program Wednesday, December 14, 7 pm MPTC, Room B-124

Brad Spanbauer is the Sustainability Director for UW Oshkosh and is involved with the Bird-Window Collision research project and the Peregrine Falcon monitoring project at UW Oshkosh. This presentation will discuss how the bird-window collision project got started in 2018 and the solution implemented, as well as an overview of the previous data collection

and ongoing research. In addition, Brad will provide a history of the Peregrine Falcon project at UWO and some fascinating stories of the peregrine falcons that are monitored around the state.

stormwater management programs and efforts, how stormwater ponds work, and what residents can do to protect area waterways. Stormwater management regulations include water quality requirements, peak discharge (flooding), infiltration, and protective areas requirements. Steps residents can do to help include household hazardous waste disposal, pet waste management, vehicle washing, yard waste management, proper pesticide and fertilizer application, stream and shoreline management, and infiltration and reuse of stormwater at residential properties. The city also has an Adopt-A-Drain program to keep storm inlet

clear of debris and obstruction.

AUDUBON HABITAT HEROES

Local Audubon Partners with the Children's Museum of Fond du Lac

The Children's Museum of Fond du Lac has an interactive outdoor play and educational space on the west side of the museum. One component of this space is a long and narrow (approximately 90' x 3') Prairie Garden. The project has been a volunteer effort from several Fond du Lac entities and organizations. Children can observe eye-catching flowers, grasses, and butterflies up close and also touch them.

The prairie garden was initially designed and installed by college students enrolled in the "Prairie Ecosystems and Restoration" course offered jointly by Marian University and the UWO-Fond du Lac campus.

The university students collected seed, stratified, and started prairie seedlings at the UW greenhouse.

Assistance was provided by the Gottfried
Prairie & Arboretum (site of prairie
seed collection) and the Fond du Lac
County Audubon Society. More
recently, the Fond du Lac County
Master Gardeners have provided
plant identification signs for
the garden.

The Fond du Lac County
Audubon Society continues to
maintain the educational Prairie
Garden at the Children's Museum
of Fond du Lac. Approximately
three times a year, Fond du Lac
Audubon volunteers weed, plant,
or complete fall cleanup at the
garden. For more information or
