## Be Part of "No Mow May"

Research has shown that one in four native pollinators are imperiled. Not mowing in May allows early flowers to grow and helps the bees emerging from hibernation. Equally important is to avoid use of pesticides on your lawn. If you are worried that your neighbors won't approve, put out a yard sign that lets them know that you are observing "No Mow May," and that your lawn is "Chemical Free." Audubon has signs that can be purchased at cost. They will be available at our Audubon events or call 920-922-7931.



#### Bald Eagle Nest Watch

Wednesday, March 12, 7 pm, MPTC Room B141

Bald Eagle Nest Watch is a Wisconsin volunteer citizen science program that works with community members to monitor hundreds of Bald Eagle nests each nesting season. Come learn about how the program works and how you can join to watch an eagle family grow while collecting important data.

Brenna Marsicek is the director of outreach for Southern Wisconsin Bird Alliance (formerly Madison Audubon), and coordinates the statewide Bald Eagle Nest Watch effort. She enjoys connecting people with the natural world through programs, field trips, events, and more.

#### Canaries in the Coal Mine: Birds and Climate Change Wednesday, April 9, 7 pm, MPTC Room B141

Dr. Benjamin Zuckerberg will present on how birds are responding to modern climate change in Wisconsin and the world. He will provide examples of changes in behavior, phenology, and range changes.

Dr. Zuckerberg has been studying the impacts of climate change for over twenty years and works closely with conservation agencies to think about how to reduce the vulnerability of wildlife to the stressors of climate change.

#### Spring Flower Hike at Kay's Ledge Saturday, April 19, 10:30 am, N7836 Cty Road WH

Enjoy a leisurely hike through Kay's Ledge during the early spring in search of the many different spring ephemerals. Please wear boots for the hike because early spring can be wet and muddy. Bring binoculars for spotting birds as well.

#### The Marsh in Our Backyard-Eldorado Wednesday, May 14, 7 pm, MPTC Room B141

James Christopoulos is the DNR wildlife biologist for Fond du Lac County/Property Manager for Eldorado Marsh and also manages the Glacial Habitat Restoration area (GHRA) lands in Dodge and Fond du Lac counties. In all, these encompass about 16,000 acres of mostly restored grasslands and wetlands. He will give us a general overview of the property and management at Eldorado Marsh.

#### Horicon Marsh Pontoon Boat Birding Adventure Saturday, May 17, 6 pm

Over 290 species of birds live in or visit Horicon Marsh each year. Participants in this 2-hour evening narrated bird trip through the marsh will seek and identify some of them. Experienced and casual bird watchers will enjoy the quiet of the marsh on this early evening tour. Bring binoculars, bird book, insect repellent, and dress for the weather. Meet at 5 pm at the southeast corner of the Fleet Farm parking lot to form a carpool for the 35 minute drive to Blue Heron Landing in Horicon. Or meet the group at Blue Heron Landing, 305 Mill Street in Horicon, for a 6 pm departure.

The cost is \$38 per person. To reserve a spot on the pontoon boat (limit of 16), a non-refundable deposit of \$20 is required before April 15, with the balance due before departure. If we do not fill the boat, the remaining seats will be open to the public.
