## ***Boys & Girls Club Summer Field Trip to Marsh Haven***

On Wednesday, July 10, Fond du Lac County Audubon, in conjunction with the Dave Stetter Environmental Education Fund, is sponsoring a summer field trip for second to fifth graders from Fond du Lac Boys & Girls Club to Marsh Haven Nature Center just outside Waupun. Dave Stetter was a long-time member and supporter of Marsh Haven, so use of these funds at this nature center is especially appropriate. In addition to small group hands-on nature activities, children will meet an animal ambassador in a large group program and watch purple martins on a critter cam. The bus will leave Fond du Lac Boys & Girls Club on Second Street in Fond du Lac at 9:15 am and return at 4:30 pm.

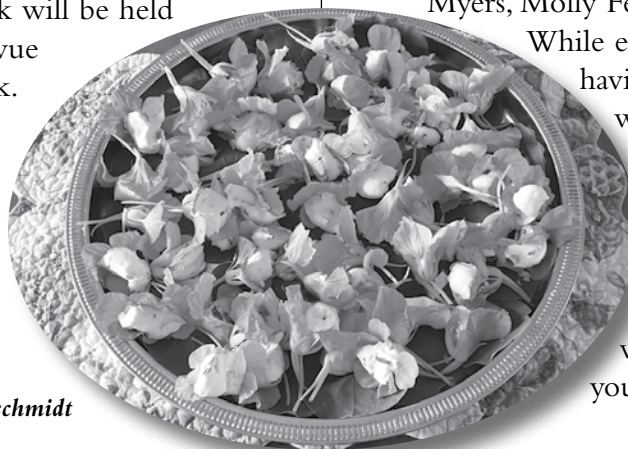

## SUMMER EVENING TUESDAY WALKS

**E**xplore trails in Fond du Lac County and City with members of Audubon. All walks begin at 6:30 pm. Carpooling is sometimes available. Wear good walking shoes, bring insect repellent, and binoculars if available. The walks will last an hour to an hour and a half. Cancelled if steady rain with the exception of July 30. **June 4 Kay's Ledge** N7836 County Road WH

This 62-acre private preserve is on the Niagara Escarpment. Enjoy woods, ledgeface with spring-fed creeks, flowers, birds, and a field overlooking Lake Winnebago. (Drive up WH. Just past the pottery place, look for our Audubon banner on a wooden fence on the west side.) *Leader – Margie Winter*

**June 11 Shaginappi County Park**

The park is a natural area of 100 acres of wetlands, lakeshore, woods, and prairie and is situated adjacent to Columbia Park, sharing Calumet Harbor. Pipe Creek also winds through the park property. (North on Hwy 151 to just north of Pipe. Turn left on Velvet Beach Road. Continue about ½ mile and turn into a parking lot on the left.) *Leaders – Dave & Kerry Sehloff*

**June 18 Mascoutin Valley State Trail**

Meet at the north end of Hageman Road, which is four miles west on Hwy 23. This section of the Mascoutin Valley Trail provides an easy walk on an elevated abandoned railroad track that passes through cattail marsh and trees. *Leader – Adam Knueppel*

**June 25 Greenway Arboretum**

Discover over two miles of beautiful nature trails along the Fond du Lac River on 24.5 acres in town. Through the efforts of ParkWatch and local citizen volunteers, restoration of native tree plantings and an oak savanna are in progress, along with new walking trails. Meet at the west side of the parking lot at the south Pick 'n Save store at 55 West Pioneer Road. *Leader – Evelyn McLean-Cowan*

**July 2 Oakfield Ledge State Natural Area, off Breakneck Road**

This property features a substantial exposure of the Niagara Escarpment as well as a unique eco-system. See undisturbed native vegetation and forest floor habitat. (Travel south on County Road Y from

Oakfield. Turn right on Breakneck Road and watch for the parking lot on the right after about two miles.) Carpool from the southeast corner of the Fleet Farm parking lot at 5:55 pm. *Leader – Diana Beck*

**July 9 Sullivan's Woods** 6342 Hay Road, Fisk

This is a one-acre prairie with surrounding woodlands. A fair portion of the trail is boardwalk due to the marsh area. Carpooling will be available at 5:50 pm from the southwest corner of the Kohl's parking lot at the Forest Mall. *Leader – Hans Neuman*

**July 16 Gottfried Prairie and Arboretum**

The Gottfried Prairie and Arboretum offers 37.5 acres of native prairie, which includes 55 kinds of native wildflowers and six species of grass, as well as a 3.5 acre formal arboretum of 250 native trees and 140 native shrubs. Meet in the east parking lot at the UW campus at 400 University Drive.

**July 23 Kiekhaefer Park** W4235 Kiekhaefer Parkway

This park of 120 acres has wonderful trails through hilly, wooded terrain and is part of the Niagara Escarpment. *Leader – Diana Beck*

**July 30 Fred's Place** W10083 Rose Eld Road

Join Nettie Burnett for a walk around the pond and through the woods at Fred Mattheis' private property off Rose Eld Road. Nettie is a member of Miniss Kitigan Drum, a spiritual family based on Native American practices. She will identify and talk about Native American uses of plants. In case of rain, we will meet in Fred's cabin to talk informally. From Fond du Lac, drive west on Highway 23 to Rose Eld Road. Turn right on Rose Eld Road and drive to W10083. Turn right onto the farm lane and drive to the north side of the pond to park. Carpooling available at 6 pm at the southwest corner of Menards parking lot. *Leader – Nettie Burnett*

**August 6 Riggs County Park**

N8137 Douglas Street, Ripon Explore the wetlands via boardwalks and a viewing platform and follow winding trails through 70 acres of native prairie.
