Stetter Environmental Education Funds Support Boys & Girls Club Field Trip

Through the Dave Stetter Environmental Education funds, Fond du Lac County Audubon provided a day-long field trip for second through fifth graders from Fond du Lac Boys/Girls Club to visit Brillion Nature Center on June 22, 2023. All the activities had the children totally engaged thanks to Jenny (Louie) Lecker, Director at the Brillion Nature Center. However, the favorite activity was pond study, especially scooping green frogs from the watermealcovered pond. On a hike through woodland and marsh, children spotted animal signs and ended the day with netting and identifying insects on the prairie.

Bats of Wisconsin–Back from the Brink Wednesday, October 11, 7 pm, MPTC, Room E120

Join Jennifer Redell, conservation biologist and cave & mine specialist with the Wisconsin DNR's Bat Program for an hour devoted to nightlife. Shy and secretive by day, but with more aerial agility than birds and the predatory ferocity of a polar bear by night, bats are amazing animals! These mysterious animals make up 20% of the world's mammal diversity. They benefit us, share our neighborhoods and sometimes even our homes, but in recent years have faced a grave threat. Hear how some Wisconsin bats are bouncing back after dramatic declines due to White-nose Syndrome. Bats need your help now more than ever—join us to learn what actions you can take to be a good neighbor to bats.

Wolves-Loved and Hated

Wednesday, November 8, 7 pm, MPTC, Room E120

We will explore the lives and behaviors of gray wolves and what they need in order to remain a part of our wild landscape. The program will include video footage from Yellowstone, along with many artifacts that will compare wolves to coyotes, foxes, and bears. Presentators Jerry Sanders and Debbie Hinchcliffe have been very active in educating themselves about wolves over the last 25 years, including having traveled to the arctic on ten different occasions to study wolves with Dr. L. David Mech.
