# Proposal to Establish a Video Archive

The Board will soon be considering my proposal to video record guest speaker presentations at our public meetings (generally held the second Wednesday of each month at 7 pm at MPTC) and archive the videos on YouTube (linked to our website). My primary impetus for suggesting this (and volunteering to evaluate its feasibility) was to provide those who cannot attend in person the opportunity to later access the presentations. In my situation, I require wheelchair transportation, but the only business offering this locally does not operate when our meetings occur. A video archive has additional benefits. For example, when recruiting new members, rather than merely mentioning the variety of topics offered by knowledgeable speakers, we can refer them to the archive to evaluate this for themselves. Also, an archive would be a repository for videos of our outings, community outreach, other events, notable plant and wildlife encounters, etc., and provide a comprehensive view of the activities and services we offer. Consequently, our video and newsletter archives will establish a legacy of the many accomplishments by the Board and other volunteers that create a dynamic, relevant organization enhancing the lives of its members and other residents of Fond du Lac County. Many Audubon groups nationwide maintain video archives but few in Wisconsin do, so we would be a trendsetter in this regard.

My report concludes that videoing and archiving can be accomplished with little or no effort or expense by us. For archiving, we would need to establish a free YouTube channel. For videoing, the most effective option appears to be Zoom or similar software in stand-alone mode on the presenters' computers, with the saved video files posted to the archive. Other options include a smartphone or rented/purchased digital video camera operated by a volunteer or hiring MPTC or Treffert Studios using their equipment. Outreach efforts to recruit students from three area schools for videoing have been unsuccessful.

Many "Audubon" groups would like to diversify and be more welcoming to minorities. Our namesake is too flawed and so groups are changing their name. The most common choice is Bird Alliance. The National Audubon is waiting for more of a groundswell before adopting a new name.

Our board has decided to gradually shift our name to Fond du Lac Bird Alliance. We will continue to mention "formerly Audubon" as a byline.
